Recent Wins

Bar Avalon fundraiser- The Co-op partnered with local restaurant, Bar Avalon, to host a fundraiser on March 14th. Bar Avalon generously donated 25% of all dine-in sales. The event was extremely successful and a great evening for members to come together and support the West Chester community.

Jon Steinman event- The Member Owner Recruitment and Engagement (MORE) committee brought in known co-op guru, Jon Steinman, for a night of learning and discussion about cooperative grocery stores. Members learned how to be an ambassador for the co-op and how to tell the story of building a community owned store in West Chester.

101 E Chestnut St- In February, the board identified a potential location for the co-op's first fully operational storefront. Board members worked hard to develop a Proforma that indicated favorable operating financials. Unfortunately, the landlord moved forward in a different direction, continuing to lease the space as a commercial office, rather than retail. Although disappointing, this was an excellent learning opportunity, and we are now prepared to evaluate future locations efficiently. The Board is keeping communications and eyes open for future locations.



DID YOU KNOW?

The Bethlehem Co-op received a federal grant in 2021 for \$2.9 million dollars. This government funding allowed their 10 years of hard work to become a reality. The grant money will be used to open a 4500 sqft store in downtown Bethlehem. The West Chester Co-op is actively seeking support for funding opportunities like this.
